Cosmetology for FEBA

FEBA launched a 3rd vocational program, joining the successful long-term sewing school & the computer science track started in late 2023.



In Congo this field is quite broad, as the French name, "Esthetics" implies. Beyond hair & nails & cosmetics, FEBA graduates will be consulted for color coordination and interior decorating.

Microfinance – Wow!

Workshops on financial literacy & recipes for popular fast-foods prepared 100 FEBA women for microloans to begin or relaunch small



businesses to be able to support their families.

Mentors & followup are provided, & most women have done very well; repayments create new loans for other women.

New Houses!

For the 2nd year, members of our partner CENEDI built 20 new houses for rape victims whose homes were washed away 2 years ago. The women & community provided labor & local materials, USA partners paid for roofing, etc. Of the 152 families who lost their homes, now 40 have moved from tents to real houses! One is the rape victim above for whom you provided surgery.

Despite floods, famine, & war, our partners help themselves & each other. In Goma (left), the city poor of Community Charity School reach out to refugees & refugees in turn help CCS make repairs to the school. In Kinshasa, FEBA sews clothes & sends them & food to Goma's orphans.
